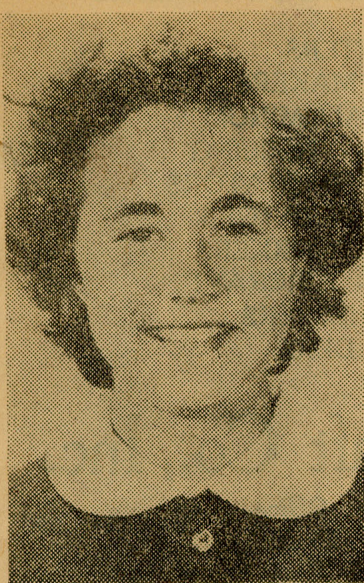


Joan Rose Honored
