OPENING REMARKS FROM THE NEW YORK STATE CO-CHAIRS

We are pleased to report the NEW YORKERS FOR JESSE JACKSON CAMPAIGN '88 is successfully off and running. Hulbert James, the New York State Campaign Manager along with Arthur Eveworking upstate have the statewide campaign structure set and fully functioning.

Jackson's hefty 11% return in Iowa this week should clearly be seen as a win for our candidate, It is quite evident that Jackson supporters reach far beyond the black community. We know the turnout in Iowa will have a strong and positive effecton the New York campaign.

Nationwide people are recognizing Jesse Jackson has developed his insight and knowledge the hard way — through direct experience. He has walked picket lines, he has travelled throughout the nation and listened to the people whose concerns are often ignored. He has met with heads of state and negotiated with corporate leaders.

From this vast reservoir of experience, Jesse Jackson has developed and articulated a program for rebuilding America — a program based on economic justice, peace and human rights. His vision of a new America has earned him the respect and support of a broad cross-section of this nation — labor,

women, clergy, business leaders, blacks, Latinos, Asian-Americans, gays and lesbians, Native Americans, elected officials, entertainers, youth, farmers and peace activists have united around Jesse Jackson's platform for jobs, peace and justice.

In 1984, Jackson won 26% of the popular vote in New York state and 47 delegates to the Democratic National Convention in San Francisco, the largest Jackson delegation from any state in the nation.

The New York campaign is our campaign - it's ours to do the very best we can and get the Jackson vote out. Jesse's win will be New York's win.

We want to thank all of you for your efforts and support thus far and we look forward to our victory on April 19th.

Hulbert James sees students playing an integral role in the campaign, first and foremost by seeking to organize college campuses around the state with an eye on getting the Jackson agenda out.


The Jackson campaign is a great opportunity for students to get involved in the political process.

A Q & A WITH HULBERT **JAMES**

Question: How do you expect Jackson to do on April 19th?

Answer: We know Jesse will carry New York State on primary day. Jackson has broad support that wasn't there in 1984. The campaign has targeted three teirs - 1) The five minority districts which hold Jackson's strongest supporters. 2) Districts we won 15% of the popular

vote or more in 1984 and expect to do | | Jesse Jackson '88 and include the better in 1988. 3) Districts he carried less than 15% in 1984 but we now feel the campaign is within stiking distance of winning a much larger percentage. He has this increasedsupport because he is addressing issues which effect the quality of life for our society as a whole. Jackson represents our best hope for a new America.

Ouestion: What area(s) is the campaign lacking or could use better support?

Answer: We are pleased with the campaign progress to date, with limited funds Jackson has the largest number of delegates and alternates filed in the state and we have our state and area headquarters running, but the campaign needs funds. Fundraising is a large part of our operation and we need the support.

Question: How does the match funding rule work?

Answer: In order to qualify for matched funding contributions should be given in the form of a check made out to New Yorkers for

name, address, employer, and type of occupation of the contributor.

Question: What is the best method to get people tied into the campaign?

Answer: People should be in touch with their area/congressional district coordinators or constituency group leaders.
