

In its official statement paper the Asian Coalition stated "In order to truly bring peace to the Indochinese and American people, NPAC and PCPJ in addition to demanding the immediate withdrawal of all GIs must also:

- 1- Demand an end to the atrocities committed against Asian people by U.S. armed forces. The racism against Asian people both here in America and in S.E. Asia must stop.
- 2- Demand an end to Nixon's Doctrine of Vietnamization, a genocidal doctrine that uses Asians to kill Asians.
- 3- Nixon's lies to the American people about ending the war while expanding the war.
- 4- Demand an immediate and total withdrawal of all U.S. armed forces from S.E. Asia. All military and other disguised forms of support to the Saigon puppet regime must cease immediately.

The Asian Coalition presence is in response to Madame Binh's request and to insure that the above four points are represented in Washington on the 24th of April. We are also in Washington to make contact with other Asian groups and individuals to build the Asian social and political movement in this country.

All demonstrators in the Asian Contingent are recognized as brothers and sisters and are fully supported by the Asian Coalition. We are asking all Brothers and Sisters to keep in mind that this particular action is a peaceful action and we are asking all members of the contingent to refrain from conduct that would violate this line. There are non-citizens, elderly Asians, and children in addition to people on their first march in the contingent. We therefore feel that violations of the peaceful nature of this march to be an undemocratic and potentially dangerous as it does not show proper consideration of one's comrades.

DRESS TIPS--- DO NOT WEAR--neckties, scarves, earrings, or any loose jewelry and key chains hanging from the neck. If possible sisters with very long hair should tuck it into their collars. It is not advisable to wear contacts, glasses should be secured.

You should not leave the group alone or without telling someone where you intend to go. If you are lost call the Asian Contingent HQ at the number above. You are to return to N.Y. on the same bus you came down on. Be prepared to feed yourself, there may be sandwich served by the Asian Coalition on Saturday evening at a post-rally meeting.
