Embassy + White House. Then we drove

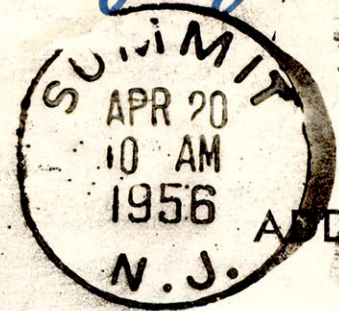
we round the river.

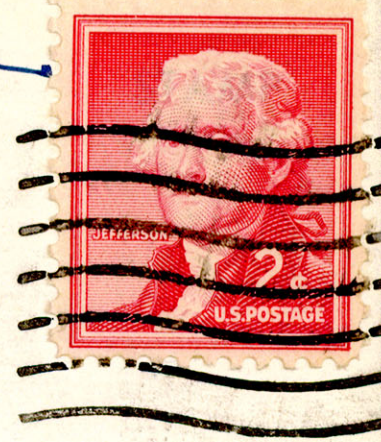
