FROM THE MINISTER'S STUDYWORKSHOP ON JAPANESE AMERICAN IDENTITY

An excellent statement is made by Asian American for Action. The excerpts from it follows:

To investigate our identity as Japanese Americans, we must look into the experiences of three generations--Issei, Nisei, and Sansei.

As Sansei, in order to know ourselves, we must understand the Nisei from whom we inherited conscious and subconscious values and attitudes. That we may accept or reject their influence is one thing, but that we do accept or reject their influence means that their influence operates on us. We must then understand the melancholy that their milieu of bitter bitterness placed on them and, only then, can we begin to know what they placed on us.

To understand the Nisei, one must understand the Issei, their turmoil of anguish and endurance in the face of pain and suffering:

LAST SUNDAY-

Despite the rains a goodly number of the congregation turned out to hear Dr. Akamatsu on a "Christian attitude toward death," and Mr. Shibata's sermon on "Jeremiah in Solitude."

The George T. Okuzaki memorial dinner was attended by over 100 people who enjoyed the box luncheon prepared by Mr. Kawamoto.

The Issei Prayer Meeting was chaired by Mr. K. Morimoto on the theme of Christian joy.

Mr. Andrew Dreeland, a middle at Union Theological Seminary will work as the field worker for our church. He will be in charge of English Sunday School, and act as advisor to the Youth Fellowship of our church. We urge Nisei parents to bring Sunday School pupils and send their senior and junior children to Youth Fellowship meetings.

What did they want? What did they believe in? What is the story of the "Shijyu-shichi-shi," (the 47 masterless samurai) and why did it mean so much to the Issei? What formed the Issei? What social and cultural heritage did they bring with them? And more...
